INDIAN COMMUNITY SCHOOL COMPETITION, MILWAUKEE, WI

The Indian Community School in Milwaukee held an invited design competition for architects to design a K-8 school for 200 students, which would also serve as a community center. The school had two programs: a traditional architectural allocation of functional spaces and a spiritual program. The design grew out of the earth as a series of vaulted pavilions facing a pond. These structures are in turn locked together, suggesting the interdependence which is central to the Indian community.
