In the late 1800's, the Chicago Sinai Congregation retained Louis Sullivan to design its first synagogue. When it came time to build a new synagogue several years ago, the congregation set out to solicit another architecturally significant design. The proposed design defined the sanctuary, reception hall, library and religious school as the principal spaces of the building. These spaces were visually connected by two major axes, emphasizing the interconnectivity of these activities in the religious program.
